Application Form

DESCRIPTION OF AWARD: The Alberta Association on Gerontology is pleased to be the sponsor of two awards to be given to graduate students from Alberta who have an interest in any aspect of aging. The award is expected to assist with costs associated with coursework, research or attendance at a workshop or conference.

VALUE AND DURATION: Up to two awards of \$1000 will be awarded annually. One award is for a Master's level student and one award is for a PhD level student. Each award recipient will also receive a free one-year membership in the Alberta Association on Gerontology.

ELIGIBILITY: The applicant must:

1. be an Albertan registered in a graduate degree program in an accredited post secondary institution
2. not be in the last term of their program
3. demonstrate an interest in any aspect of aging
4. agree to contribute an article for an edition of the AAGmag (e.g., a written summary of research)

The individual who receives the Edmonton Chapter or the Calgary Chapter Student Award is not eligible to receive a provincially sponsored award in the same year. An individual can receive the provincially sponsored award only once in their degree program.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE: A complete application will consist of five parts:

1. A two-page cover letter that includes a description of the applicant's current studies or research, relevant volunteer/work experience, and future plans in gerontology (academic, research, practice).
2. A completed application form.
3. A copy of the applicant's curriculum vitae.
4. A copy of post-secondary education transcripts (they do not need to be original).
5. A letter from the student's supervisor.

SELECTION PROCESS: The awards will adjudicated/administered by the Alberta Association on Gerontology Provincial Board.

CRITERIA: Applications will be assessed on academic merit as illustrated by grades and educational attainment, relevant work/volunteer experience, current studies/research plans, future commitment to the field of gerontology, and an indication of how this award will be used to support the applicant's interest in gerontology.

APPLICATION DEADLINE: **March 31 2010.** The awards will be presented at the Annual General Meeting.
